
LUCKY STEVENS

Stevens, originally from Montvale and Dumont, has served a lengthy apprenticeship in places like Nashville, where he frequented the storied Bluebird Café, and New York, where he's been seen at that seed bed for future music stars, The Bitter End. Typically, his set mixes tunes by the likes of the Beatles, Eric Clapton and John Mayer with originals from his two albums, "Heart of a Fighter" and "Downstairs at Mayo's" (a third CD is in the works). But for this opening slot at the Rundgren show - a duet with Montclair guitarist Van Manakas – he'll be concentrating on originals like "I Don't Want to Waste Your Time" and "Déjà Voodoo Glow."
